Our children at Bloomers Day Nursery have been enjoying learning about Autumn, carving their own class room pumpkins and designing them using paint and glitter. The children have been enjoying learning to count using natural autumnal objects such as leaves, sticks and conkers, they have enjoyed exploring mud trays with natural autumnal objects inside also and exploring the outside in Autumn. The toddlers have focused on their fine motor skills by being able to independently use the scissors to cut out leaves for their autumn activities



Our babies have enjoyed welcoming some new friends to their room, enjoying playing alongside each other and joining in with circle time singing sessions focusing on their PSED. Development.
